1. Entry Day - Tuesday, from 9:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m.
2. Judging Day - Wednesday, at 9:00 a.m.
3. Release Day – Sunday, from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
4. Rules and Regulations are listed in the front of the Fair Book for all Open Class entries.
5. Fee - \$ .10 per entry for each exhibitor, paid at the time of registration.
6. No altering or repair of flowers/plants after entry placement.
7. No artificial flowers may be used in artistic arrangements.
8. All materials used in arrangements (fresh or dried) **must be locally grown**, not florist material.
9. Flower colors may not be altered.
10. Decorative spray may be used when needed in arrangements.
11. An arrangement of flowers should include foliage (evergreens, shrubs, leaves or branches are examples of foliage)
12. Accessories can be used unless stated otherwise.
13. A figurine is used to help the theme. It can be used as a container or a freestanding addition to an arrangement
14. An arrangement listed for fresh flowers may not contain dried flowers.
15. All plants must be disease and insect free.
16. No plant, dried flower, or arrangement that has received a premium in a previous year may be re-entered.
17. ALL PLANTS MUST HAVE BEEN IN POSSESSION OF THE EXHIBITOR 60 DAYS PRIOR TO THE FAIR. EXCEPTION – MULTIPLE PLANTINGS, SUCH AS TERRARIUMS & DISH GARDENS AND MUST HAVE BEEN GROWING TOGETHER FOR AT LEAST SIX (6) WEEKS.
18. All “Any Other” entries MUST BE IDENTIFIED ON THE ENTRY TAG.

**CLASS B - FRESH FLOWER BOUQUETS**

1. Exhibitor must comply with required number of blooms or exhibit will be disqualified.
2. Definitions:  
Spike - Single stem - Example: snapdragon, gladiolus, delphinium, etc.  
Bloom - Single blossom - Example: zinnia, peony, dahlia, etc.  
Stem - The ascending part of a plant - Example: petunias, French marigolds, cosmos, phlox, etc.
3. LEAVE A LITTLE FOLIAGE FOR INTEREST.

**CLASS C - DRIED FLOWER BOUQUETS**

1. The dried flowers entered must be from this year or the previous year only.
  2. Dried flowers that received a ribbon the previous year may not be entered again.
  3. No Water - Remove all Foliage

**CLASS D - CUT FLOWERS**

Foliage should remain on flowers

**CLASS E - HOUSE PLANTS**

1. Rules for entering are the same as flowers
  2. Any hanging plant must be in a pot 10" or less and ready to hang with hook.
  3. All plants must be disease and insect free, well groomed and in clean pots with saucers.
  4. Any house plant may not be in a pot over 10"
  5. No artificial means of shining leaves.
  6. A PLANT THAT HAS RECEIVED A RIBBON IN A PREVIOUS YEAR MAY NOT BE ENTERED THIS YEAR.
