1. Entry Day - Wednesday, August 20, animals in place by 3:00 p.m.
2. Judging Day - Saturday, August 23, starting at 9:00 a.m. in the Walters Building.  
Open Class judges first then Jr Fair.
3. Release Day - Sunday, August 24, starting at 6:00 p.m.
4. Pens will be assigned by the Junior Fair Goat Superintendent. All exhibitors must show with the youth organizations whose leader approved the entry.
5. Each exhibitor must care for and feed the animal or make arrangements to have it fed.
6. No changes will be allowed after blanks are submitted.
7. Every Goat must be provided with a collar. **All body clipping must be done prior to the fair, only touch-up clipping is allowed.**
8. Age will be computed from the opening day of Fair.
9. No bucks may be shown.
10. No horns allowed unless horns are specific breed standard.
11. No animals shall be exhibited if due to freshen within two weeks prior to Fair opening and the two weeks after Fair opening except if the owner offers in writing a release of liability to everyone. Present this written release to the Superintendent on entry day of Fair.
12. No more than four animals may be exhibited in Junior Fair.
13. Champion Ribbons and/or Trophies will not be awarded unless there is competition.
14. **HEALTH REGULATIONS:** See front of fairbook and any required health certificates/copies must remain in the Expo office during Fair.
15. Exhibitors must show their own animals. If assistance is needed, it will be provided by the ring help.
16. **JR. FAIR EXHIBITORS MUST WEAR THE EXHIBITOR NUMBERED HAT/HARNESS WHILE SHOWING. FAILURE TO WEAR THE EXHIBITOR NUMBER WILL RESULT IN PREMIUM MONEY FORFEITURE!!!**

### Classifications

Junior Kid - Born after March 31 of exhibit year

Junior Yearling - Born between July 1 and December 31 of previous year

Senior Kid - Born Between January 1 and March 31 of exhibit year

Senior Yearling - Born before July 1 of previous year and less than 24 months of age

Herd - Consist of one doe under 1 year, one yearling doe and one doe 2 years or older, all owned by the same exhibitor

Junior Get-of-Sire - Consist of three does under 2 years that have never freshened, the get of one sire. The animals need not be owned by the same exhibitor.

Senior Get-of-Sire - Consist of three does, at least one to be in milk and get of one sire. The animals need not be owned by the same exhibitor.

Produce of Dam - Consist of two does any age, the produce of one doe. Both owned by the same exhibitor.

Dam and Daughter - One doe any age and its dam. The animals need not be owned by the same exhibitor.

**First Blue Ribbon winners from previous fairs must move up a grade division. However, winners in Lot 101 may continue to compete in that division.**

101. Grades 9 & Above

**HERDSMANSHIP**

Herdsmanship ribbons will be given to the top half of the clubs/youth groups in the Goat Department.

**HERDSMANSHIP SCORE CARD**

Pens & Animals - 16 points

Exhibitors - 12 points

Club Sign; Decorations & Cards - 10 points

Aisles - 8 points

Storage & Feed - 4 points

Total - 50 Points

1. Decorations cannot be wider than an 11-12 inch board.

2. A traveling herdsmanship trophy will be awarded to the 1<sup>st</sup> place winner. The trophies and ribbons will be presented on Sunday afternoon following the Parade of Champions. If an organization is awarded the trophy for three (3) consecutive years, the organization is permanently awarded the trophy.
