1. Entry Day - Wednesday, August 20. Animals must in place by 2:00 p.m.
2. Judging Day - Friday, August 22, **starting with the cow classes** at 9:00 a.m.
3. Release Day - Sunday, August 24 starting at 6:00 p.m.
4. If valid registration papers are not presented to the Dairy Superintendent by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday (entry day), the registered animal will not be allowed to be shown.
5. Stalls will be assigned by the Junior Fair Dairy Cattle Superintendent. All exhibitors must show with the youth organizations whose leader approved the entry. Junior Fair exhibitors must keep dairy cattle with the Jr. Fair exhibit.
6. Each exhibitor must care for and feed the animal or make arrangements to have it fed.
7. Junior Fair dairy exhibitors may enter six (6) animals, but may show a maximum of four (4) animals. Each exhibitor must pay a manure fee per animal, with a maximum of four animals. Only one animal may be entered per class. (ATCP requirement)
8. Black & White Holstein cattle entered in registered classes must be shown in the registered class in which they are entered. The Registered Holstein Ancestry (RHA) must be 87% or higher to show in the registered Black & White Holstein classes.
9. In the Ayrshire, Guernsey, Brown Swiss, Jersey and Red & White Holstein Breeds, grade and purebreds will be shown together.
10. Animals shown in the Red and White Holstein Classes must have a red and white haircoat.
11. Champion Ribbons and/or Trophies will not be awarded unless there is competition.
12. All dairy animals exhibited must be the exhibitors own project.
13. **Sketch blanks are required for all dairy cattle and must be signed by the exhibitors leader and or advisor.**
14. **ALL ANIMALS MUST HAVE A PERMANENT ID NUMBER, EAR TAG OR TATOO TO BE SHOWN AT FAIR. TAGS ARE AVAILABLE FROM DHIA, VETERINARIANS, AI TECHNICIANS, ETC.**
15. HEALTH REGULATIONS: See front of fairbook and any required health certificates.
16. It is suggested that at least 30 days prior to the Manitowoc County Fair, all dairy animals receive a 9-way and a Pasturella vaccination. The 9-way vaccine may be administered as either a modified live (one injection needed) or a killed vaccine (initial injection followed two-four weeks later with a booster). Modified live vaccines should be used on nonpregnant animals only. Please consult your veterinarian.
17. State regulations prohibit the sale of milk for human consumption that is produced other than in proper facilities. The dairy cattle exhibitors have voted that the proceeds from the sale of milk produced at the Fair be used to improve dairy facilities. Thank you for your support!
18. Exhibitors are responsible for any damages due to contaminated milk at the Milk Parlor during the Fair.
19. Finish or touch up clipping will be allowed in designated areas by exhibitors, family members and/or leaders. It is recommended that body clipping be done prior to the Fair.
20. Dairy exhibitors must show their own animals. If assistance is needed, it will be provided by the ring help. Unruly animals will be tied up on the side of the show ring.
21. **JR. FAIR EXHIBITORS MUST WEAR THEIR EXHIBITOR NUMBERS WHILE SHOWING. FAILURE TO WEAR THE EXHIBITOR NUMBER WILL RESULT IN PREMIUM MONEY FORFEITURE!!!**

Dairy Showmanship will be held on Thursday, August 21, 2008, following open class dairy judging at approximately 12:30 p.m. Any exhibitor who exhibits in Dept #1 (ATCP 160.15) is eligible. **Exhibitor must show their own project animal.** You must make entry on your registration blank to participate in Showmanship. First Blue Ribbon Winners from previous fairs are not eligible to compete in the same age division. Showmanship is judged in order by numeric lot numbers. Exhibitors in the Grades 11 & above class may win twice, after which they are ineligible for showmanship.

- 1 Clubs cannot use decorations wider than the 11-12 inch boards that are furnished. Display booths are not permitted in Jr. Fair Dairy Exhibits.
- 2 Consideration will be given to maturity of animals in the exhibit. A traveling herdsmanship trophy will be awarded to the 1st place winner in each group. The trophies and ribbons will be presented on Sunday afternoon following the Parade of Champions. If an organization is awarded the trophy for three (3) consecutive years, the organization is permanently awarded the trophy.

MANITOWOC COUNTY FAIR PRODUCTION AWARDS

1. The Manitowoc County Fair will award four trophies to the exhibitor(s) of the highest production record at the Manitowoc County Fair. The trophies will be sponsored for the following classes: Three year old, Four year old, Aged & Dry cow. Trophies will be presented to the exhibitor showing the cow with the highest combined butterfat and protein record (CFP) in each of the four classes.
2. Trophy sponsors include: Manitowoc County DHIA, Genex/CRI, Country Horizons Coop and North Star Select Sires.
3. To be eligible to compete for the production trophy, the exhibitor must meet the following requirements:
 - * Animal must be entered through an approved youth organization (4-H, FFA, Jr. Holstein Association, Girl/Boy Scouts) project at the Manitowoc County Fair for this year and in some previous year by the exhibitor. Exhibitors need to indicate what year(s) the animal was previously shown at the fair.
 - * Only Official DHIA or DHIR records will be accepted.
 - * The DHIA record must be signed by the DHIA field technician supervising the record, the youth organization leader and the youth exhibitor.
 - * The last completed 305 day record is required. The cow must have completed the 305 day record sometime after August 1, 2008.
 - * Awards will be presented based on actual 305 day records. 3X records will not be discounted.
 - * Entries, production records and their certification are to be sent to Dairy Agent Scott Gunderson by August 1st. All Entries must be signed. Entries after this date will not be accepted.
 - * The winner(s) will be announced and the trophies presented during the Cow classes of the Junior Fair judging on Friday afternoon. Awards cannot be received more than once for the same record.

HERD BUILDER AWARD

The 1st place entry in this contest receives a registered heifer calf courtesy of GreenStone Farm Credit Services. Any Jr. Fair dairy cattle exhibitor age 12-15 as of January 1, 2008 may enter. Scoring is based on the exhibitor's knowledge, interest and enthusiasm of their dairy project and the number of animals exhibited. Contact your dairy leader or the Manitowoc County UW-Extension office for applications. Entries are due on August 1st. Please send your application to Scott Gunderson, Manitowoc County UW-Extension Dairy Agent.

OUTSTANDING DAIRY CATTLE YOUTH EXHIBITOR

The 1st place entry in this contest receives a \$500.00 scholarship to be used toward a post-secondary education in production agriculture. Manitowoc County dairy exhibitors fund this scholarship through the milk sales from the county fair along with funding from CP Feeds and the George VandeLoo Memorial. Any Jr. Fair dairy cattle exhibitor age 16-19 as of January 1, 2008 is eligible to enter. Scoring is based on the exhibitor's knowledge, interest and enthusiasm in their dairy project. Plans for the future are also considered. Contact your dairy leader or the Manitowoc County UW-Extension office for applications. Entries are due on August 1st. Please send your application to Scott Gunderson, Manitowoc County UW-Extension Dairy Agent.

FARM BUREAU KIDDIE SHOWMANSHIP

This year the Farm Bureau Young Farmers again will be sponsoring a Kiddie Showmanship Show at the Manitowoc County Fair. The show will be on Sunday, August 24, 2008 at 11:30am in the Walters Building (showring).

Requirements:

1. Calf must be born between April 15, 2008 & August 1, 2008. It can be either a heifer or bull calf. It must be a dairy animal.
2. There are four classes: 4yr/Preschool, Kindergarten, 1st grade & 2nd grade. Classes are by completed grades.
3. Calves must be at the fair by 10:30am on Sunday and taken home after the show because there is no barn space available.
4. Children are not required to wear white clothing.
5. Calves need not be clipped.
6. Children will be required to wear a number which will be passed out prior to the show.
7. Children will be judged on the way they handle the calf and basic showmanship skills.
8. If you have children in each age group they may show the same calf, however, it is discouraged because of the young age of the calf (tire easily). If you have two children in the same age group, they will need two calves.
9. Trophies and ribbons will be awarded, but there are NO cash prizes.
10. To be eligible to enter Kiddie Showmanship Show you must complete a registration form, which is available from the Farm Bureau Office or the Manitowoc County Expo Office.
