

JUNIOR FAIR POULTRY

1. No fowl, of any type or class, showing any evidence of disease may be exhibited at the Fair. If, at any time, any fowl in this group shows evidence of a contagious or infectious disease, it shall be removed from the exhibit and slaughtered or returned to owner, at the option of the State Department of Agriculture.
2. All poultry exhibited must be raised and shown by the exhibitor. Any other youth exhibitor may show entry if approved by Superintendent. No changes will be allowed after blanks are submitted.
3. Only open to members enrolled in the Poultry Project or doing equivalent work who have kept records of their project for at least three months.
4. All poultry exhibited at the Fair must meet the Standards of their breed or they will be disqualified.
5. Entry day is Wednesday, August 20, **doors will open at 8:00 a.m.** All exhibits must be in place by 6:00 p.m.
6. Individual conference judging will be on Friday, August 22, beginning at 9:00 a.m. Showmanship to follow.
Doors will open at 8:00 a.m.
7. Release time is Sunday, August 24, between 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. Claim checks will be required to have your poultry released.
8. Exhibitors are encouraged to padlock cages to prevent vandalism.
9. Exhibitors must furnish their own feed, feeding and watering utensils, bedding and care for their own poultry on a daily basis. Please use shavings only as bedding in cages (no straw, please). If you must use something other than shavings, you must clean out your cage at release time on Sunday.
10. An exhibit shall consist of birds hatched after January 1, 2008 (pullets & cockerel). Prior to 2008 (Cocks & Hens)
11. All birds including ducks & geese must be banded with a numbered leg band. Leg bands can be purchased from the Superintendents. A list of numbers & colors should be supplied to the Superintendent on Entry Day.
12. PULLORUM TESTING - **All poultry** except pigeons must be certified Pullorum-Typhoid free. Exhibitors must show proof that their birds are pullorum free when bringing them in on entry day, **you will also need to submit a copy for permanent record.** When you buy young birds, ask for a paper showing they are pullorum free. Birds must be tested 3 weeks prior to Fair. **Testing will be done at the Small Animal Building on Wednesday, July 23rd, 2008 from 7:00pm to 9:00pm and also, on Saturday, August 2nd, 2008 from 10:00am to 12:00noon.** Testing will be done by the Manitowoc County Poultry and Rabbit Committee. Anyone not having proof of testing cannot bring birds into the Fair. This is a Federal Law. **No testing will be done at Fair.** There will be a small fee for testing.
13. Anyone entering in the Market Classes is required to send letters to potential buyers, inviting them to bid on your Blue Ribbon winners at the Auction on Sunday, August 24, 2008.
14. No more than 12 entries not to include showmanship or Market Class. (Not more than 4 entries per species)
15. In all “Any Other” categories, breed must be named on registration blank.
16. Cloverbuds or Tiny Tots: DO NOT ENTER THROUGH 4-H. Enter by calling Cele at 682-9247.
17. **NO ANIMAL(S) SHALL BE SOLD IN OR FROM THE BUILDING DURING THE FAIR. A BULLETIN BOARD IS PROVIDED FOR ADVERTISING OF ANIMALS. ANY ANIMAL SELLING CAN BE DONE ON SUNDAY AFTER 6:00 P.M.**
18. See health requirements in front of book.
19. **ANY EXHIBITOR THAT MAKES CAGE ALTERATIONS WITHOUT APPROVAL FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT WILL FORFEIT THEIR PREMIUMS.**
20. **JR. FAIR EXHIBITORS MUST WEAR THE EXHIBITOR NUMBER WHILE SHOWING! FAILURE TO WEAR THE NUMBER WILL RESULT IN PREMIUM MONEY FORFEITURE!!!!**
21. **Saturday, August 23 and Sunday August 24 doors will open at 9:00 a.m.**
22. Only ONE (1) person on an entry blank.

The following items will be considered in making the final decision: Preparation of Exhibit, Appearance and Attitude of exhibitors and Care of Exhibit. (food & water, cleanliness of cage) Decorations (Fair theme and fair colors) Storage of supplies. Donated Herdsmanship Awards (paid by Manitowoc Poultry Club):

KIDDIE (or TINY TOT) SHOWMANSHIP

Each exhibitor must bring his or her own animal (you can not use a poultry entered in another class) by another exhibitor. Rosette Ribbons will be awarded along with Champion and reserve Champion Trophies. No cash prizes.

Enter by calling Cele at 682-9247 with the breed and sex that you want to enter.

Bring your entry in on Wednesday, August 20, 2008 by 6:00 p.m. It must stay the duration of the fair.

DO NOT send your entry to the 4-H office or the Expo Office.

POULTRY AND RABBIT MARKET SALE

OBJECTIVES:

1. To provide Junior Fair Poultry and Rabbit exhibitors an opportunity to sell top quality poultry and rabbits at the Manitowoc County Fair.
2. To provide incentive and encourage a stronger development of white meat animal project.
3. To recognize members who do quality work in breeding, selecting, feeding and showing the market poultry & rabbits.

WHAT WILL BE OFFERED

1. Poultry to be auctioned will be the blue ribbon entries in each of the poultry market classes (#117 - #121)
2. Rabbits to be auctioned off will be the blue ribbon entries in each of the rabbit market classes (#120 - 123)
3. Note: Please enter your animals in the market classes and Poultry & Rabbits Market Sale only if you intended for it to be sold and processed. Since only the blue ribbon entries in each market class are eligible for the Auction, it is not fair to the other exhibitors if you enter a market class without intending to sell your animal. Any exhibitor who decides not to sell their animals in the Poultry & Rabbit Market Sale, if eligible, will be barred from the Market Classes & Sale for the next two years.

WHEN IS THE SALE

The Poultry & Rabbit Market Sale will be held on Sunday, August 24, at 1:00 p.m. in the dairy cattle judging area.

WHO CAN BUY:

1. Anyone interested in encouraging youth.
2. Anyone who enjoys and appreciates good quality meat.
3. Anyone who would gain beneficial advertising value.

SALE PROVISIONS:

1. Potential bidders register at Sales Ring (no obligations).
2. Animal weights will be provided, but bidding will be based on an entry basis; i.e., meat pen, pair or single animal class entry.
3. All accounts are to be settled with the clerk immediately after the sale. The buyer will assume ownership of the animal if taken live after 6:00 p.m. Sunday. All market animals should remain for the duration of the Fair.
4. Sale participants must be present when their animal is called to the auction block or they forfeit the right to sell. The only exception is if they must report to college on the day of the sale.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

1. Entries open to all bona fide 4-H or FFA members or any other youth organization in Manitowoc County.
2. Make entries on regular County Fair registration blanks under the respective market classes noted in the Fairbook.
3. The number of animals exhibited and the number of premiums given will follow County Fair regulations.
4. The sale will be conducted by the Manitowoc County 4-H Leader's Poultry & Rabbit Committee. Ten percent of the selling price will be deducted from the exhibitor's receipts to go into a fund to pay for advertising the sale and conducting the sale. Checks will be mailed to the exhibitors after the animals have been delivered to the buyers.

POSTER CONTEST – ALL POSTERS MUST BE HAND WRITTEN AND DRAWN (NOT COMPUTER)

Open to anyone exhibiting in the Poultry and/or Rabbit Projects. Each Exhibitor is allowed to enter one entry in each department. Bring entries to fair by 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 20, 2008. All photos should be on a 14" x 22" poster board.
