

OPEN CLASS ANTIQUES

Department 19 – Superintendent – to be announced

1. Entry Day – **Tuesday, August 24**, from 9am-7pm.
2. Judging Day – **Wednesday, August 26**, at 9am.
3. Release Day – **Sunday, August 29**, between 7pm and 9pm.
4. Fee is \$.10 per entry for each exhibitor, paid at the time of registration.
5. Antiques must be more than fifty (50) years old unless specified.
6. All exhibits must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor.
7. All articles entered for exhibition must be delivered in person.
8. Articles of a collection, display, or group cannot be entered separately for individual premiums. A collection shall be limited to three (3) pieces.
9. Each exhibitor is responsible for placing exhibitor's tags securely to his or her own exhibit.
10. No premiums will be awarded for any article not properly entered. All articles must be entered in the proper class.
11. Exhibitors must present claim checks corresponding with entry tag when calling for exhibits, and must not remove exhibits without superintendent or assistant superintendent being present to check out entries.
12. The Expo Board and Superintendent reserve the right to determine whether an article is worthy of exhibition. In case an article is in poor condition, but is valuable because of its age or rarity, these factors will be taken into consideration when scoring.
13. Every precaution will be taken to ensure the safety of exhibits, but in no case will management be responsible for loss or injury.
14. Each exhibitor is limited to one (1) entry per premium number.
15. Entries will be limited to eight (8) per exhibitor.
16. In preparation of the exhibit, please clean or polish before entering only if it does not devalue the item. Write on the Exhibitor's card, "The item was not cleaned because this would devalue the item" to inform the judge that through research you found that the item would be devaluated if cleaned. Example: Copper may be polished or unpolished and is the exhibitor's choice.
17. Please tape covers securely to item.
18. On a 3"x5" index card, for viewer's and judge's interest, write the item name and a brief history about the item. Staple the index card to the entry tag. Judge will read each entry card (this does not mean all cards will be read out loud) and the card may be used to break a tie.
19. Items over fifty (50) years old need to be handled with care. Picking up an item by the handle will be avoided whenever possible.
20. There will be no comments and/or appraisals from the judge on the value of any item entered for this has no bearing on the scoring.
21. All entries will be photographed when brought in. Two (2) pictures will be taken.
22. At the end of the fair when entries are being picked up by the exhibitor, he or she will have the option of purchasing the Exhibitor's tags will be closed at the time of judging and the duration of fair.
23. Merit Award will be awarded to the best of show.
