

OPEN CLASS DAIRY CATTLE

1. Entry Day – **Wednesday, August 25**. Animals must be in place by 2pm.
2. Judging Day – **Thursday, August 26**, at 9am.
3. Release Day – **Sunday, August 29**, starting at 6pm.
4. Stall Rent – a stall rent of \$1 per animal and a manure fee of \$2 per animal will be charged and paid at the time of registration.
5. All exhibitors of animals three (3) years old and over in any of the procreative classes of this department must produce evidence, if asked, indicating the animals are not barren.
6. Breeding cows must have produced a living calf within two (2) years preceding the day of the exhibit.
7. All animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor or farm name and certificate of registry presented to the superintendents. The Registered Holstein Ancestry (RHA) must be 87% or higher to show in the registered Black & White Holstein classes.
8. Only one (1) prize in group or herd classes to one (1) exhibitor. No more than two (2) entries per entry number may receive premiums in individual classes.
9. All decorations must fit on the 11-12 inch furnished boards, they cannot be any wider than the boards.
10. State regulations prohibit the sale of milk for human consumption that is produced other than in proper facilities. The dairy cattle exhibitors have voted that the proceeds from the sale of milk produced at the fair be used to improve dairy facilities. Thank you for your cooperation!
11. HEALTH REGULATIONS: See WI County, District, & State Fairs 2010 Animal Health Rules and Regulations located on the Web site. Any required health certificates/copies must remain in the Expo office during the fair.
12. It is suggested that at least thirty (30) days prior to the Manitowoc County Fair, all dairy animals receive a 9-way and a Pasturella vaccination. The 9-way vaccine may be administered as either a modified live (one injection needed) or a killed vaccine (initial injection followed two-four weeks later with a booster). Modified live vaccines should be used on non-pregnant animals only. Please consult your veterinarian.
13. **If Registration Papers are NOT presented to the Dairy Superintendent by 5pm on Wednesday (Entry Day), the animal will not be allowed to be shown.**
14. Red and White Holsteins must be registered in the Red and White Association.
15. Animals exhibited in the Junior Fair show cannot be shown in Open Class group classes.
16. **Touch up clipping only in stall area.**

Senior Yearlings that have calved will be shown as Two Year Old

Minimum of 10 cows in a given breed must be checked in at the fair in order to the split the 2 and 3 year old class

2 Year Old	Born between September 1, 2007 & August 31, 2008
3 Year Old	Born between September 1, 2006 & August 31, 2007
4 Year Old	Born between September 1, 2005 & August 31, 2006
5 Year Old & Older	Born before August 31, 2005
Dry Cow – 2 Years and Over	Born before September 1, 2007 must have milked 280 days or more or be shown as dry on DHIA test sheet
Jr. Get-of-Sire	3 animals under 2 years old, not more than one bull, from the same sire
Produce of Dam	2 animals either sex, any age, the produce of one cow
Sr. Get-of-Sire	3 animals all over 2 years old, not more than one bull, from the same sire.
3 Best Females	Animals need not be owned by a single exhibitor. Any age, all bred, and owned by the exhibitor
